

Replied that having been all these Patients had not
been sent but should so soon as he was capable of com-
ing to the Board, however by his desire to Mr Bladon Esq.
at my office of October 1st 1702 last informing that all was
safe and convenient for him to come part supplied
Oyer to the Honble Board Nov^r 13th and said a further
order requiring his appearance at the next Council on
Cane his Patients were not complied with in the mean-
time but nothing being done Col^r Parrot did appear
before the Honble the President Col^r Plummer & Mr

& notwithstanding proposed to right, they dispatch them being himself in good health, & that the good Mr. Godshaws night
Landed 28^r of January last, & remitteth intell my that

Mr. President offered him time to write by the latter end
of March, now writing that the Patients might be recorded
before the next President and to be then delivered to the
Supreme Planchard concerned yet did not the said Col^r
Parrot upon his these purpose giving no reason for
his refusal but that my Lord Bultmore & his Officers
were not to be paid up or limited to any certain sum but
to do it when they convenient or minds to that
Effect.

I do therefore in behalf of her most Majestie of the
Country & of my self in due discharge of my Office lay
the same before the Honble Board and desire that
a full enquiry Command may forthwith issue forth
requiring the said Col^r Plenry Parrot to send in
the Patients account to be recorded in the Secretary's
Office according to the Presidents proposal by the last
Day of March next at his Court
