

The Board that Col. Darnall had been summoned but that
not being a full Council nothing was done

Resolved that the Clerk of the Council write a Letter to
Col^o Darnall & send a Copy of Mr Thomas Lawrence's Rep^o
and return with all the proceedings & advise him to finish & send
in the said Returns to the Secretarys Office by the last of March
next otherwise this Board will be obliged to pay with her
Majestys Secretary in making a due Representation of this
matter
