Resolved that the Clerk of the Council write a Letter to  
Col<sup>o</sup> Darnall & send a Copy of Mr Thomas Sauncocks Rep<sup>o</sup>  
petition with all the proceedings & advise him to finish & send  
in the said Petition to the Secretaries Office by the last of March  
next otherwise this Board will be obliged to pay with her  
Majestys Secretary in making a due Representation of this  
matter
