

The said Order was delivered to the Marshall who came
 and made return upon Oath to the Board that he went
 with his Boat within twenty or thirty yards of the Eagle
 Advice Boat and Captain Bostock being upon the Quarter
 Deck held out his arms & put them stand by & asked what
 Business they had whereupon they told him they had an
 Order from the Council to deliver to Mr. Symonds then he
 said they might come on Board whereupon the said
 Marshall said he had an Order to deliver to John Symonds
 the Carpenter & asked for him who was not to be seen but
 One of the Ships Crew told the Marshall deliver his Order
 to him for that Symonds had sent him for it & such time
 as he had delivered it to that person & not before they told
 him that he alone without any Body else might come
 on Board but after a small time that they had been by
 the Ships Side Captain Bostock told them put of from
 the Ship & be gone about their Business

The Council Late Present as Yesterday

Captain James Mitchell Commander of the Ship
 Owners Adventure of London that notwithstanding that
 Captain Bostock had received on Board the two men which
 he had sent him & that the said Captain Mitchells Ship
 was but very recently manned he had still detained two
 of the three men he lately impressed from on Board the Ship
 Owners adventure
