one of the Ships Crew told the marshall he delivered his Order
to him for that Symonds had sent him for it such time
as he had directed it to that person & not before they told
him that he alone without any Body else might come
on Board but after a small time that they had been by
The Ships Side Captain Bostock had them free of from
the Ship & be gone about their Business

The Council Sat Present as Yesterday

Captain James Mitchell Commander of the Ship
Cinnes Adventure of London that notwithstanding that
Captain Bostock had received on Board the two men which
he had sent him & that the said Captain Mitchells Ship
was but very weakly manned he had still detained two
of the three men he lately unrefined from on Board the Ship
Cinnes adventure

Resolved that the Marshall carry the following
Order on Board the Ship Eagle Advice Boat
