Then will the right Honourable the Lord of Hollesby upon  
her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State's Letter of the  
1<sup>st</sup> of March last desiring these Commissioners to prohibit  
Correspondence with the French Settlement in America which this Board do say that they have no Reason  
to believe any such trade  
exists or correspondence practicable by any Indubitable  
Evidence in the Province against which Proclamation  
has already been issued & all possible care will be used to  
enforce it.

Please see and vindictive her Majesty's Secretary of  
State's Letter prohibiting any arms to be sold or supplied  
to the French in Quebec now in war with her Majesty  
to which this Board do say they are sensible that  
they can have no such supply from this Province

Print a Letter from the humble the Commissioners of  
her Majesty's Customs desiring due care to be taken that no  
Publick Pictures be shipped out of this Province unless first  
Chancery Court, pursuant to the Act of Parliament made  
therefore.

Ordered that the several Officers of her Majesty's  
Customs be admonished where their utmost care in inspection  
and no such Pictures be shipped in this Province.
