^{to believe any such trade} ~~to believe any such trade~~
writing or correspondence practicable by any Inhabitants
or Traders in this Province against which Proclamations
have already been issued & all possible care will be used to
enforce it

Read his said Lordships her Majesty's Secy of
State Letter prohibiting any arms to be sold or supplied
to the French or Spaniards now in war with her Majesty

To which this Board do say they are sensible that
they can make no such supply from this Province

Read a Letter from the humble the Commissioners of
her Majesty's Customs desiring due care to be taken that no
Sulphur should be shipped out of this Province unless in
Wheat & Cask pursuant to the Act of Parliament made
therefor

Ordered that the several Officers of her Majesty's
Customs be admonished to use their utmost vigilance
that no such Stuffs be shipped in this Province

Then was perused and read his Excellency Nathl
Blakeney Esq her Majesty's Governour Letter to the Board
& Council hereof Dated the 10th of February 1702
