The Honble President presented to the Board a Letter from George & Bladen Esqrs the Admiralty Board Officers & Admiralty Papers concerning the same that Captain Moore in his Ship Oxford by her own Master brought into Puttawent River Prize and that he the said Mr Bladen on Behalf of the said Captain Moore desired in case Colonel John Hammond the Judge and H<sup>r</sup> Bladen Register of her Majesty's Court of Vice Admiralty could not conveniently come down to Puttawent in order to condemn the said Prize that a special Commission might be granted appointing some other persons at Puttawent thereunto in regard the said Captain Moore was much indisposed & his Ship very short in her Provisions. In answer where to his said Honour the President had written to Mr Bladen of Captain Moore as follows viz.

I have yours by your Servt & have considered what you write in relation to Captain Moore commander of her Majestys Ship Oxford & the Prize by her brought within this Government I have seen the honble Col<sup>o</sup> John Hammond chief Judge of her Majestys Court of Vice Admiralty in this Province who being apprised that Capt Moore has brought his Prize into this District of Puttawent thinks it Reasonable that he by himself or procurator ought to Exhibit his Title to the Court here in order to her condemnation which will be expedited as soon as desired if he thinks
