 Council Ennals gives account that upon
 Receipt of his Excellency's Letter he went to an
 Indian the Chief of the Proptanks and asked
 the Prankake Indians why they did not come
 and renew their Treaty with his Excellency the
 Governour who answered that they were abroad
 hunting but within a months time they would
 come and pay their respects to his Excellency &
 renew their Treaty. - He acquainted them how
 injuriously the Piscataways had dealt with us
 for which they seemed to be much concerned. -
 Resolved the Council sit to morrow morning. -
