Mr. Hill answered they were men had been training and fired them for their pleasure and whatever it to any body he would fire more against which the said Doctor disapproved him nevertheless the said Hill opened a trunk & took out two pistols and as this Declarant believes fired them off for that this declarant heard the report of two pistols or other fire arms immediately after.—

Whereupon Dr. Gray and the Board representing Mr. Joseph Hill's presumptions believed in firing so many guns in the night whereby his & the Guarded all the inhabitants of his town were alarmed and the Sheriff obliged to send a boat and hands to know the reason and notwithstanding that the said Hill was advised by Dr. Thomas Decker to send to him by the Sheriff to desist from any more, he would not take any notice ther-
