Canon
That all matters of Law ~~shall~~ be abated
and ~~shall~~ Demurred and pleas and writs of Error
be argued and heard at Bar and not at the
Chancery unless in Criminal matters; wherein
Exceptions to Indictments may be allowed to be
heard, and that the practice be as usual as
may be to that of the Kingdom of England
Except arguing of Exceptions to Indictments moving
in arrest of Judgment thereon.

That Rules of practice be advised and agreed on
by the said Judges and practitioners to be prepared
and presented to His Majesty the Governour and
Council in assembly for Confirmation.

1793
That the Termes be held at Annapolis the
first day of April the first of June the first
of September and the first of November yearly
and that the Assizes be begun and held the
first of May and first of October in last Sundays
and continue until all the business be con-
pleted.

1794
That the Assembly will seriously consider of
this her Majesty's most and Indigent Condi-
tion and by some Law settle an Annual Salary
upon such Judges to be appointed and Confi-
renated by His Majesty the Governour of the
fittest and discreetest persons of this Province
Always Freeholders and Inhabitants of and
within the same; which Salary cannot be less
then one hundred pounds Annually besides
their Travelling Charges to be borne by the Sec-
rall Comities.
