is as follows Viz.

My Lords & Gentlemen

It is with great Satisfaction we can now tell you
that we have this Morning received a Letter from the
King wherein His Majesty is graciously pleas^d to
acquaint us that His Majesty is hastening further to
employ his utmost care for putting these Kingdoms
into a happy and flourishing condition.

He has Comanded us in the Meane time to continue
our Care of everything that may conduce to the Peace
and Safety of his Dominions. And we are assured that
if this had required his more immediate presence
He would without the least Delay have repaired
hither with us.
