New York October 18. 1714 —

On the 11th Instant the Obsequies of our late Sovereign Lady Queen Anne of Blessed Memory were performed here wth great Decency & Order About eleven in the Morning, & about one of the Clock the same day His High & Mighty Prince George Elector of Brandenburg was proclaimed here King of Great Britain. Francis Johnston first at his Majesty's Court & afterwards at the City Hall, & after his Excellency our Govern^r was attended by the Garrison under Arms & all Circumstances both House & Court his Majesties Council the
