Which being read & considered and resolved that y^e same be

a Duplicate of a Letter from y^e R^{ts} Hon^{ble} the Lords of Trade
and Plantations Dated y^e 11th of August 1714 Requiring him
forthwith to Proclaim in His Majesty our most Gracious
& Sovereign King George King of Great Britain
without loss of time give Acc^t to His Majesty's High
having been already done in all parts of this Province
and y^e Acc^t thereof sent to Great Britain to their Lordships
is thought to be a full Compliance with their Lordships
Letter also in the y^e following Cause was observed
concerning this Excellency that by the Act made in the
first Year of y^e Regne of her late Majesty Queen Anne of
Glorious Memory Intituled an Act for y^e Security of her
Majesties Person and Government and of y^e Succession of the
Crown of Great Britain in the 10th Statute in y^e 1st of the
Said Act and the Privy Signett used at the Time of
her late Majesty's Demise were to be made use of till by
Majesties further Direction.
