God save the King -

This being read & resolved that same be
forthwith published in all parts of this His Majts Province.
His Excellency was also pleased to Communicate to Board
a Duplicate of a Letter from R^t Hon^b the Lord of Trade
and Plantations Dated 11th August 1714 Requiring him
forthwith to Proclaim his Majesty our most gracious
soveraign King George King of Great Britain etc
without loss of time & give Rec^t to the other of which
having been already done in all parts of this Province
and Rec^t others sent to Great Britain to the said Ships
is thought to be a full Compliance with the said Order.
After also in the Letter following (which was obser^d in
consequence of his Excellency that by the Act made in the
first Year of our Reign of her late Majt^y Queen Anne of
yernie & more intituled an Act for Security of her
Majesties Person and Government and of Reception of the
Empire of Great Britain in the Protestant Religion upon
the several Islands and the Towns signified at the Time of
her late Majt^y Demise were to be made before telling
Majesties further Direction.
