are Expressly restrained from taking any Goods and
Merchandise on board their —

Whereat which we are desirous to signify unto you that
you take particular Care for future of aforementioned
Treaty be punctually observed & put in Execution and
that no illegal Trade be carried on between his Majt's
Province of Maryland under your Government and the
French Settlements in America by any of his Majt's
Ships of War attending thereto or by other
British Ships as likewise no vessels of the French
Subjects allowed to Trade from their Settlements
to Maryland. Now bid you heartily farewell and
