

We further find by the particular Article of Instruction
to the Captains of the Ships of War that they Captains
are expressly restrained from taking any goods and
Merchandise on board of their Ships

Upon all which we are to be desired to signify unto you
You take particular Care for the future of the forementioned
Treaty be punctually observed & put in Execution and
that no illegal Trade be carryed on between his Matys
Province of Maryland under your Government and the
French Settlements in America by any of his Matys
Ships of War attending their Province or by other
British Ships As likewise you do the French
Subjects be allowed to Trade from their Settlements
to Maryland. So we bid you heartily farewell and
are
