

in America and the Indies, in consequence of the
to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby declar-
ing that all such Passes of the said former which have been issued
shall not continue in force longer than the thirtieth day
of July next, and we do hereby strictly charge & command
all our loving Subjects who are or shall be possessed of any
such Passes that they do as soon as may be return the same
into the Office of Admiralty of Great Britain in order to
their being cancelled. And whereas pursuant to the
late Treaty with Spain it is absolutely necessary that
all Ships and Vessels belonging to our loving Subjects of
Great Britain and Ireland, as well as our Foreign Go-
vernments and Plantations, which shall have Occasion
to trade to Portugal the Canaries Guinay Indies and
the Mediterranean or elsewhere in the way of Guinay
of the said Governm^t of Spain should be furnished with
passes of the said Governm^t by or before the thirtieth day of July
next lest by their being not so by the Ships of Spain
unfurnished with such Passes they be brought up & the
Ship and Goods confiscated, we do hereby strictly charge
and require the Owners and Masters of all Ships and Vessels
of our loving Subjects trading to aforesaid to take particular
Care that they do timely furnish themselves with Passes of the
said Governm^t accordingly. — Given at our Court at
St James's the fourth day of Octob^r 1714, in the fifth year of
Our said Majesty.

And for that it is absolutely requisite that His Majesty's
said Proclamation should be notified to all His Majesty's
said Subjects in the Province to the said
