to publish this Our Royal Proclamation heretofore containing  
of all such Passes of the former which have been issued  
shall not continue in force longer than the thirtieth day  
of July next it is hereby strictly charged and  
all our loving Subjects who are or shall be possessed of any  
such Passes that they do not return the same  
into the Office of Admiralty of Great Britain in order to  
their being cancelled. Whereupon pursuant to the  
late Treaty with Portugal it is absolutely necessary  
that all Ships and Vessels belonging to our loving Subjects of  
Great Britain and Ireland, as well as our Foreign Gov-  
ernments and Plantations which shall have occasion  
to trade to Portugal the Canaries Guinea & islands into  
the Mediterranean or elsewhere in the way of  
the said Government of Portugal shall be furnished with  
Passes of our own by or before the thirtieth day of July  
next last by their Commanders by the ships of Portugal  
unfurnished with such Passes they be brought up to the  
Ships and Goods Confiscated, and so hereby strictly charge  
and require the Owners and Masters of all Ships and Vessels  
of our loving Subjects trading to us to take particular  
care that they do timely furnish themselves with Passes of  
the same accordingly. — Given at our Court at  
St James's on the third day of October in the year of  
Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eight years of  
Our Reign. —

And for that it is absolutely requisite that this Royal Proclamation should be notified to all the singular  
in Mass Subjects in the Province to the end that  
they may be duly accounted to him who is His Majesty's
