Cancelled and that such other persons as shall desyire
any baggage from this Province may have of the
Moorish provide themselves with such paper as
may be had upon their application to and before
the office of any of the Collector of his Majesties Customs in
this Province a Considerable Number of which
being sent from Admiralty Office ready
to be had and purposed — Given at my City
of Tunis on this thirteenth day of April in
the first year of ye Regime of our Lord King
George the Third 1715 — God save the King

any illegal Trade being carried on between
the said Province and any of the French Colonies
