this juncture. Resolved and advised that
the Sheriffs & the Justices of the several Counties
make diligent inquiry what Quantity or
Quantity of powder and Lead are in the hands
of any Merchant or trader, and that they
immediately in writing certify the same for his Majesty's
Service, to be lodged with and secured by the
respective Sheriffs of the Counties and pay for
at the publique Charge. And in case it
be discovered that our Neighbour Indian have
a Correspondence with the Southern Indian
advised that His Majesty's any three of the
Council will send an Order against selling any
powder or Lead to Indians. -
