

But that one or more of the Justices thereof should meet  
 at the day of the return of the process to take the returns  
 thereof and appearances or recognizances, and order  
 the other proceedings to be generally continued to be  
 approved first Tuesday of May next and thereunto  
 -out any further proceedings to adjourn the said  
 Court to that time and that in the mean time  
 His Excellency will be pleased to give his pro-  
 -clamation intimating the same to the Sheriffs  
 Jurors Evidence Suitors and others to prevent their  
 trouble and expense in coming over the Bay and other  
 distant parts of the province to attend the said Court
