By His Excell^{ty} the Cap. Gen^l. *Proclamation*
Whereas It is thought advisable that the Provincial
Court which now stands adjourned until Tuesday the
thirteenth Instant, should not proceed to any further
Business, next to the taking the Returns of the
Process of the said Court, and Appearances and Recogni-
zances to that time, and to order the Process of the Court
to be generally continued, and then to adjourn the
Court to the first Tuesday in May next; I have there-
fore by and wth the Advice of His Majesty's Hon^{ble} Coun-
cil within this Province, thought fit to issue this
my Proclamation, notifying the same, to the End
that the ser^{vs}. Jurors, and Witnesses, summoned to
the s^d. Court and all Suitors thereto (save such as are
concerned on their Appearances & Recognizances, may
not give themselves the Troubles & Expence of attend-
ing thereon, from which They are hereby discharged,
and to the End that all persons may have due and
speedy notice hereof, I do hereby strictly Command
and require the respective Sheriffs of the ser^{vs}.
Counties in this Province forthwith to publish this
my Proclamation, in the most publick and fre-
quented places, of their respective Counties. Given at
London the 8. day of Sept^r, in the
Reign of our Sovereign Lord George,
King of Great Brittain.
