

reference to the Law And by his said Letter Authorizes  
his said Excellency to appoint Naval Officers & says  
he will do everything that shall be thought necessary  
to supersede that part of Mr. Carrolls Commission -

Mr. Love in the next paragraph of his Letter  
Observes to his Lordship that he was entirely unacquaint-  
ed with the nature of the Offices of Surveyors & Naval  
Officers and the manner of conveying them And if  
there has been any error made either in the disposal  
of the Surveyors or Naval Officers places the Govern-  
ment must attribute it to his friend Mr. Carroll.

Then his Lordship the Lord Guilford Observes -  
that as to the Surveyors he shall authorize his Excellency  
to appoint the several Surveyors in the Counties during  
pleasure And in the meantime he commands his Excellency  
the Governour to hear all disputes and Complaints that  
shall be made to the Surveyor Generall

In the last paragraph of his Lordships said Letter  
in answer to one of his Excellency's he says he has  
told him before in the said Letter his Opinion of  
Papists and the Law, And that he prettors himself  
by his Managementall grievances will be redressed And  
that he will continue Cheerfull in his Employment

Whereupon his Excellency declares to the Council  
that he takes himself to be very much honoured  
by this paragraph of his Lordships Letter And  
is entirely satisfied his Lordship had no intention  
to promote any papish but that what Mr. Carroll  
had obtained was purely by surprise as his Lordship  
is pleased to observe
