the Extraneous Charges therein, the said Jones
accepted of three pounds ten Shillings Court money
in full for that voyage -

board to answer the promises is asked by his Excellency
by what law or rule he Charges and Exacts his
several fees especially that of Twenty pence
of Coquett, answers he Charges them by Custom
being what have been usually charged by former Collectors
