

Afterwards the Governour presents them that we  
are willing to receive the Articles of Peace made in the year  
1683 which if they will they may have some ~~land~~  
lands

The Indians say they have the same word that  
they have not consented to have them but fully agree to the  
Government thereof and that were all Lands

As also upon a Great man of the Mandache Indians  
being asked by the Governour if he had any thing on behalf  
of the Indians to Offer to this Board

He presented Articles of Peace made between the  
late Governour and them Indians and Comptains that the  
English have killed upon their lands by which means they  
have not land enough to make Corn fields on and desires  
to renew the said Articles of Peace with his Honour the  
Governour

The Governour his Honour the Governour confirms the said  
Articles by writing them as follows viz

The above Articles on behalf of Lord Baltimore  
Renewed by

Chas. Calvert

August 19 1721

That the said Articles were acquainted by  
the Governour that the Honorable Lloyd Bayliff Esq<sup>r</sup> Highman  
and Col<sup>l</sup> Mathew Highman their appointed Commis-  
sioners by law to do them Justice in relation to their Com-  
plaints about the bounds of their lands

The Governour appoints to meet in Council in the  
afternoon and the Governour the Indians that he shall give  
them notice then to attend he having further to say to  
them
