I shall write you, Sir, with a more particular
account of our proceedings in this matter but this is at
the request of these Indians to accompany them from
your Honors.

And afterwards the Governor is pleased to speak to them
as follows

My Good Friends

Because I would have you and all our good
Friends to you rich and happy I earnestly advise you
to take care to preserve your selves and not to go to war with
any of your Neighbours when you may live in peace for
twenty hundred years so good to you as the saving ones of your
Brethren and children alive

And then upon the Governor delivered to the said In-
dians two stroud Match Coats and one stroud Match
Coat to each of the others in token of his Friendship with
them and a stroud Match Coat to each of the Interpreters
for their service

And afterwards the Governor is pleased further
to say

I wish you a good Journey to Virginia and that
you may all be friends and I shall be glad to see you as
you come back from Virginia and so farewell

Afterwards the Governor sends for Squaws to drink
with the said Indians the following night this and have
