to suffer the said Indians to pass over the said ferry without  
pay the said ferry men to be paid by the publick

His Honour the Governour Letter to the Governour of  
Virginia about the Indian Affairs is as follows viz

Sir  
Some Representatives or Deputies from the Seveque  
Nations have been down to renew their former Articles of peace  
with this Province and as I have with the Advice of my  
Council made some progress therein with them I thought  
it might not be Improper to communicate to you our proceed-  
ings with them which I therefore inclose you and beg you  
to be refered to them and least the proceedings of y<sup>e</sup> Pennsylvania  
Government should not yet become to your hands I like  
wise send you what I have in print of them
