

Armitage presents to the Governor a Bill of Indentures
as presented by them to the Senegues and Manducates
in their joint letter in token that the Senegues & Manducates
are all one all Friends

Armitage shows to the Governor a Bill of
Pacts which is presented to the Governor to be carried to the
Governor and presented to the Governor then in token that
the Manducates and Senegues have taken Friends with the
Governor of Virginia all as they are with us

Armitage further reports to the Governor of the Senegues
and Manducates that as when all Friends of any Society
or other names should come against them as we must
all follow another of it and help one another but not
to go far out to make War against our Enemies that we
by long and alliance wholly defensive

The Governor presents to Armitage two Manducate
Manducates that in token for himself and the other
for the Senegues a great many of the said Manducates are
Return of their Bill of Pacts and in token that we are
all Friends having presented the Senegues Yesterday

The Senegues likewise tell the Governor they heartily
thank him for sending them by water to Virginia and
that if any further harm should happen to them they should
not lay it at the Governor's Door but take it upon them
selves

As for the discourse with the Indians Interpreters they
say they did not tell that the Indians that killed their
the new friends to Virginia but that we mistook them for
that they say these Indians live towards the Sun setting
from the mountains and over a River from Virginia and
that the Virginia Indians and they were often fighting
