God save the King
Chas. J. Calvert and his Lordship

Col. Nathaniel Wynson of Virginia being
for your sake for that tract and declares as follows
That about sixteen years ago he being High Sheriff of Cecil
County then was well of possession directed to him to
seize one Patrick Murphy of a certain tract of Land
but that at that time there happened to be a division of
Kent and Cecil County it being his Will to fall into Kent
County had not an opportunity of executing said Will
but that one Mr. Thomas Hilton who was High Sheriff of
Cecil County as said Wynson afterwards understood
said Hilton executed said Will and had put said Murphy
in possession of the Land by him received and that after
wards said Wynson had from Mr. Hilton that Col. French
from New Castle had taken him Prisoner and carried
him to New Castle upon his executing said Will of Pos-
session, upon ^{hearing of} which said Wynson went to the then Gov.
Seymour, who to the best of said Wynson's Remembrance
wrote to him the said Wynson in answer thereto, which
Letter he believes he has still by him the substance of which
said Letter to the best of his Remembrance is that the Gov.
said it was none of his Business to contend about his
Lordship's right

Therefore Col. Wynson is desired by this
Board to lodge with the Clerk thereof such Letters as
he has by him relating to this Affair in order to be recorded
