God save the King  
Charles Sackville and his Lordships

Cit Hallward Mysnowe of Kinlandy Esq: and  
for your self & all your and others as follows viz  
that at the present time you are my paymaster of Kent  
County there was a will of Hesford directed to him to  
pay his neffate Mr Murphy of Colchester man of Land  
but that at that time there happened to be a division of  
Kent and Essex County: it being his toll to fall into Kent  
County but not as opportunity of executing said Will  
but that Mr Thomas Hiller who was appointed the  
officer County assaid Mysnowe afterwards understood  
said Hiller executed said Will and had paid said Murphy  
in proportion of the land by him recovered and that after  
wards said Mysnowe had from Mr Hiller that Col French  
from New Castle had taken him prisoner and carried  
him to New Castle upon his executing said will of Pay  
hearing of <sup>his</sup> execution said Mysnowe wrote to the then Govr  
Seymour, who to the best of said Mysnowe's remembrance  
wrote to him the said Mysnowe in Anno 1700, which  
Letter he believes he has still by him the substance of which  
said Letter to the best of his remembrance is that the Govr  
said it was none of his Business to contend about his  
Lordships right

Whereupon Col Seymour is desired by this  
Board to lodge with the Clerk thereof such Letters as  
he has by him relating to this affair in order to be recorded
