3 That as soon as you perceive an Indian nation in those
Indians to surrender up the Negro Slaves that are now among
them unto the English that you propose to them that some of
their Indians as will bring them down to Annapolis shall
there receive for every man three two Shroud Watch Coats &
One Gun

4. That as this Government sent to the said Pochasetta
and Cwecocquin Shroud Watch Coat and a pair of Silks Stock-
ings unto each of them as a Token of our desire of living as
Friends and Brethren with them so let those Indians know
that if they will send down those Negro people that have lived
among them for the Reward of one Shroud and a Gun as af-
fore said we shall look upon the same as a token of their desire to become
our Friends and to live as Brethren with us
