

Maryland vs

By the Lieutenant General
& Proclamation

Whereas I abdicated Whitehall in London in the Reign of the late King James the Second it was voted by your Assembly that the Land of Maryland on the west side of Delaware Bay had been inhabited planted by Christians and continued to be a distinct Colony from that of New England and before the death of the late Lord Baltimore it was agreed that the tract of Land lying between the River and Bay of Delawar and the River Choptank on the one side and Chesapeake Bay on the other side should be divided into equal parts and that that part thereof lying towards Delaware Bay should belong unto his Majesty and that the other part lying on the west side of a division Line drawn from the Latitude of Cape Henlopen unto the 40 degree of North Latitude should remain unto the Lord Baltimore as Conveyed within his Charter as is expressly set forth in the Order of Council which for the greater Satisfaction of all persons whom it shall concern may be seen therewith made publick as followeth.
