It is evident from the above Indenture howe fully  
many people have and may plant and lay the lands  
apart from the Virginian lands to be only part of those  
lands which ever was in difference between the two  
provinces of Maryland and Pennsilvania for those descript  
able lands according to the line and design of the Indenture  
extended only towards Delaware Bay and the Ristain  
Secondly and an report of these other lands is not so much  
as is intended to be planted early by Christians which lie  
towards the Swageland naturally the outer it self determin  
ed to belong unto the said Baltimore Long portion  
that within this Charter is it any longer to be doubted  
whether Maryland ought to extend Northward to the 40<sup>th</sup>  
Degree of North Latitude seeing that the lands to the  
Southward of that Line upon the west side of the De  
laware have been hitherto granted on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of June  
1632 Granted unto Cecilius Lord Bawn of Baltimore  
a meadowland plante in terms as would compass the  
designe of the Gunwirre unto that part of Delaware Bay  
which lies under the 40<sup>th</sup> degree of North Latitude from  
the Equinoctial but take away all Room for Land it  
is further declared to be the very place where New Eng  
land ended the Gunwirre of New England at that day ex  
tending from the Northward unto the degree of forty in  
north latitude as Maryland was extended from the  
Southward unto the same line of 40 and left no space  
of land betwixt the two Gunwirs Moreover the said Bawn  
day was capitulatively discribed was fifty three years  
afterwards confirmed againe unto the said Lord Proprietor  
of Maryland by the above Order in Council whch appointed
