It is evident from the above Citation how greatly many People have used in settling the Lands upon or near the Susquehanna to be any part of those Lands which are ever now in difference between the Proprietors of Maryland and Pennsylvania for those disputed Lands according to the true and design of the Charter granted by towards Delaware Bay and the Eastern Sea and an report of those other Lands not so much as much as to be planted early by Christians) which by towards the Susquehanna and by the order it self determined to belong unto the Lord Baltimore as long as he did within his Charter nor is it any longer to be doubted whether Maryland ought to extend Northward to the 40th Degree of North Latitude seeing that the Lands to the Southward of that Line and on the west Side of the Delaware have been granted that is on the 20th day of June 1632 granted unto Cecilus Lord Baron of Baltimore in express and positive terms as words can speak the design of the Grantor, unto that part of Delaware Bay which lye under the 40th degree of North Latitude from the Equinoctial but to take away all Room for it it is further directed to be the very place where New England landed the Grant of New England at that day extending from the Northward unto the degree of forty in North Latitude as Maryland was extended from the Southward unto the same Line of 40 and left no Space of Land betwixt the two Grants Moreover the said Boundary so originally described was fifty three years afterwards confirmed again unto the said Lord Proprietor of Maryland by the above Cited Council which appointed
