Following order of Council was made out and sent vix  
By the Governor and Council March  
the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1722

It being pretended in a paper presented before your view  
of all that has been done or publicly talked for these twenty  
years last by you concerning the Boundaries of the Province  
of Maryland and Pennsylvania that dear Gentlemen  
Mayistrates and others of the Northern parts of Maryland  
waited upon M<sup>r</sup> Penn out of respect to his Honor in the  
year 1700 as he was travelling from below the界 to visit  
the Indians at Onondaga and that they stopped in the Ford of  
Delaware River telling M<sup>r</sup> Penn they had now accompanied  
him into his own Province and therefore desired to take their  
Leave you are hereby Ordered to take the deposition of John  
Hall Esq; as to his knowledge of these matters whether any  
such Gentlemen Mayistrates and others of the Northern part  
of Maryland waited on M<sup>r</sup> Penn that year and who they  
were and whether they stopped in the Ford of Delaware River  
as is pretended and told M<sup>r</sup> Penn what is above specified

It being also pretended that my Lord Baltimore  
had fixed the Northern limits of Maryland at or near the  
mouth of Delaware River and from thence caused an easterly  
Line to be run by his Surveyor General to the River Delaware  
The Board observed that no proofs appeared of any such Line
