 very peacefully with them that further in June last these  
 Magistrates had very unreasonably made a seizure of Isaac  
 Taylor the Surveyor Magistrate and Member of Assembly  
 for the County of Essex and Ebenezer Hatchell another Magis-  
 trate of the same that those two persons having engaged  
 to appear at Cecil Court in August last when the Governor  
 was obliged to undertake his journey to Albany he sent an  
 express to his good friend the Governor of Maryland to have  
 that matter removed but all the Revolution taken in  
 it as to find satisfaction by the Report of James Logan  
 and Peter A. B. Wharton whom he had desired to wait on that  
 Governor's Court now that those two men should be  
 Court over to the Provincial Court at Annapolis which  
 they were pleased at length to respice on account of his ab-  
 sence on that important Journey that he had since wrote  
 to Col<sup>d</sup> Calvert requesting that all those differences might  
 be over as they were till both Governors could in person ad-  
 just them which he had proposed <sup>to Col<sup>d</sup> Calvert</sup> to do by a Conference if  
 that Gentleman would be pleased to meet <sup>him</sup> that three days  
 ago he had received a letter from Col<sup>d</sup> Calvert dated the 18<sup>th</sup>  
 of last month now read to the Board by which it manifestly  
 appears that the that worthy Gentleman cannot forget  
 his character and innate Goodness yet some Councils seem  
 of late to be entered on Maryland inconsistent with the  
 tranquillity of his Majesty's Subjects in both Governments  
 the Governor therefore desires the opinion and advice of this  
 Board what measures may be most proper for him to take
