That it is nowen thing in America that the
Boundaries of these Provinces should be for many years
undetermined since of New York and New Jersey being
so to this day yet this Board never heard that. Nor does any
one what damages to them were committed in such Cases
or that Officers were employed to make Survey or even
the Settlements of each other.

Upon these Considerations it is the advice of
this Board that the Governor would be pleased to state
these matters fully to the Governor of Maryland whose
great understanding and humanity can never approve
of such unfriendly, not to say Hostile Proceedings, that
the Governor would also be pleased to give himself the
trouble to meet that Gentleman and in the most friendly
manner labour to discuss all former Complaints with
the occasion of them, and to stipulate such measures
as may prevent them for the future until the Bound-
aries are settled that in the meantime effectually to
end these differences applications be made to the pro-
prietor at home to pass a final Adjustment of the Bound-
aries that in case the Province of Maryland hitherto
our Good Neighbour should now so far change their
measures as no longer to preserve peace with us, the Govr.
would then be pleased to present the matter effectually
to the King and his Ministry and in the mean time
by all legal Methods to support the peaceable people
