 de w<sup>ts</sup>. Cornwallis which deed to the best of this deponents  
 Remembrance bore date the 4<sup>th</sup> of January 1723 and was  
 made as between Henry Bray Son and Heir of Henry  
 Bray late of London Player & and Roger Painter Son  
 and Heir of Roger Painter late of Handover in Hampshire  
 Brothers to Nicholas Painter & Katherine Painter Sister  
 to Nicholas Painter Katherine Tuder and some others  
 and the several parties names mentioned as parties to the  
 deed were w<sup>ts</sup> to seals at the foot of the deed Except Henry  
 Bray as Guarantors and William Vanhaesduck Riddles  
 de w<sup>ts</sup> also William Cornwallis was mentioned in the  
 said deed as Guarantee thereof but for better Certainty this  
 Dependant refers himself to the said deed in the said  
 Knights hands and further saith not
