Memo rando n that it is this 21 day of  
May 1725 agreed upon by and between his Honour  
the Governor and Council of the said Province of the  
One Part and John Caldwell of Somerset County of  
the other Part Himself that the said John Caldwell  
for and in Consideration of Ninety five Pounds Curren-  
cy to be paid him the said John Caldwell his heirs  
Executors Administrators all signs by their Honours  
upon furnishing and completing the Chambers hereafter  
mentioned viz

Upon his own paper Cost and Charges Glafs  
and Nails <sup>only</sup> accepted in which their Honour are to find the  
said Caldwell to say to Shingle the Armorij with three  
low back Windows frames of Cedar or Cypress to be  
made in full Proportion and Uniform to those of the  
Hall House and the said Caldwell is at his own
