Deposition which he accordingly produced and upon pe-
ruse of the same the whole appears to be Mr Tolsons hand
except the two last Lines being Mr Griffiths and the date
and place being Mr Boudleys who himself at the Board
acknowledges that at Tolsons Request he did write the form
of the Preamble on a piece of paper and gave it to the said
Tolson and that when Tolson brought the Deposition again
he writt the date and place thereto but never intended
to make any use of it nor was he any other ways concerned
