

I never intended your having the News.....as soon  
 as possible. I have however given General my orders for  
 sending your husband like wise to Virginia. I hope you will  
 pardon the omission of proclamation was likewise made  
 at New York ten or twelve days before I proclaimed here  
 for I was willing to wait for Orders from the other side  
 which is usual on such like occasions but upon second  
 thoughts I judged if there was any Error it was one on  
 the right side and therefore I appointed Thursday the  
 31<sup>st</sup> of the last month for proclaiming his present Ma-  
 jesty. In the morning I ordered 30 Minute Guns to  
 be fired and began them about 11 in the forenoon after  
 they had done firing these guns my Council the Mayor  
 of the City Altemann and Common Council with the plan-  
 equal Gentry of the Town and Country assembled at my  
 House and went in Procession to the Court House where  
 a platform was erected and there made proclamations  
 with many loud declinations of long live King  
 George the Second our guns again firing a Volley the  
 Procession walked back to my House where we drank  
 the King the Queen and Frederick Prince of Wales  
 Health our guns again firing to each Health and at  
 night there were more Bonfires and Illuminated <sup>Flowers</sup>  
 than ever had been seen in this place. I cannot conclude  
 before I beg you'll believe that I shall embrace every Op-  
 portunity to demonstrate that I am with all Respect  
 and sincerity. Your Obedient
