Hugh Jones Minister of the same Church and Parish, Provided you have performed or do perform all and singular the Acts and Services requisite for your Qualification as a Minister of the Church of England and of this Parish pursuant to the Canons and Constitutions Ecclesiastical of this Church of England and the Laws of England and this Province To have hold and enjoy this Church to you the s. Hugh Jones so long as you shall act and conform your self as a Minister of the Church of England according to the Canons and Constitutions of the Church of England and the Laws of England and of this Province together with all and singular the Rights Profits and Advantages whatsoever by the Laws and Customs of this Province appertaining to a Minister of this Parish: And I do hereby require the Churchwardens Vestrymen and all others the Parishioners of this Parish to receive and acknowledge and to aid and assist you the s. Hugh Jones in all Matters relating to the Discharge of your Function as the Minister of this Parish and to all and singular the Rights and Profits to you theretofore appertaining GIVEN at Annapolis this 2. Day of October in the 17th Year of His Lordships the Lord Proprietars Dominion of Annoq Domini 1731

Article 1. That the Kings Majesty under God is the Only supreme Gov. of this Realm of Great Britain and of all Other His Highnesss Dominions & Countries as well in all Spiritual or Ecclesiastical Things or Causes as Temporal, and that no Foreign Prince Person Prelate State or Potentate hath or ought to have any Jurisdiction power superiority Preeminence or Authority Ecclesiastical or Spiritual within his Majestys

2. That the Book of Common Prayer and of Ordering of Bishops Priests and Deacons, containeth in it nothing contrary to the Word of God, and that it may lawfully be used, and that I myself will use the form in this Book prescribed in publick Prayer & Administrat. of the Sacraments and none Other

3. That I allow the Book of Articles of Religion agreed upon by the Arch Bishops and Bishops of both Provinces and the whole Clergy in the Convocation holden at London in the Year of Our Lord God 1562 And that I acknowledge all and every the Articles therein contained being in Number Nine and Thirty besides the Ratification to be agreeable to the Word of God
