Domini 1731 At the House of the Honourable Benedict Leonard Calvert Esq. in the City of Annapolis appeared the Honourable Samuel Ogle Esq. in Presence of the Honble Charles Calvert Esq. Philemon Lloyd Esq. Col Richard Tilghman Col Matthew Tilghman Ward John Rowby Esq. Benjamin Tasker Esq. and Philip Lee Esq. Members of His Lordships Council and produced His said Lordships Commission constituting and appointing him the said Samuel Ogle Lieutenant General and Chief Governor of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon in America, & also Commander in Chief both by Sea and Land of all the Forces raised or to be raised in the s. Provinces; which being published and read, is ordered to be recorded in the Secretary's Office
