Order and Instructions to our Trusty and Well beloved
John Ogle Esq: Governor and Commander in Chief of
the Province of Maryland

1. You shall call our Council, and make known to them Your Commission
and publish your self accordingly

2. You shall be Chancellor be aiding and assisting to our Agent; and
Judge of our Land Office in all that relates to their respective Offices, and
sign all Proceedings relative thereto

3. You shall farm if you think it for my Service my Rent Books of
the whole Province at the rate of twenty to twenty five per cent Discount,
taking such Security as my Agent and Attorney General for the time being
shall approve of, obliging the Farmers to make Returns or Rent Rolls yearly to
my General Rent Roll Keepers of the respective Shores, as you will the Advice
thereof and shall think proper

4. My General Rent Roll Keepers to be by you appointed shall be Two,
one on the Western, the other on the Eastern Shore, for which they shall be
allowed five per cent on the amount of the Rent of the respective Shores, if farmed,
collected, on so much as is and shall be collected within the Year, which
