If his late Majestys Petition from the Province of Maryland have  
been presented to his Majesty at this Court the one from the Governor  
unfounded and the other from the Committee of Safety of that Province  
which proclaiming agreement amongst other things that there was but  
one spending in his Majestys high Court of Admiralty of Great Britain  
between the Lord Baltimore Proprietor of Maryland and the Family  
of the Penns who are the present Proprietors of Pennsylvania concerning  
the liability of certain articles of Agreement entered into between them  
for adjusting the Boundaries of their respective Provinces. That per-  
ceiving the said Petition & Catechesis have been committed upon  
the Borders of the Province of Maryland by the Inhabitants of the  
Province of Pennsylvania who have hitherto been in it and burnt the  
town himself & his children & two others were in it and burnt the  
same to the ground & that whilst the said Town endeavoured to  
escape the Flame several guns were fired at them whereby one Man  
was killed and others wounded and several were taken Prisoners and  
Carried to the said town in Pennsylvania Wherefore the Petitioners most  
humbly pray amongst other things his Majestys most Gracious Inter-  
cession & summons for the promulgation of the peace on the Bor-  
ders of the said Province and whereas the Lords of the Committee  
of Council to whom his Majesty referred the consideration of the said  
Petition have made their Report thereupon to his Majesty at this  
Court His Majesty this day took the said Report into his Royal  
Consideration who was pleased with the Advice of his Privy Council  
of Officers whereon heen advised & his Majesty doth hereby  
dulye & command that the Governors of the respective  
Provinces of Maryland & Pennsylvania for the time being Do not  
open suit of incurring his Majestys highest displeasure for permit-  
ting any Tumultuous Riot or other Unlawfull Disturbance to be  
committed on the Borders of their respective Provinces But that they  
do immediately put an stop thereto and use their utmost endeavours  
to procure Peace & quietness amongst all his Majestys Subjects under  
their Government. Inhabiting the said Province his Majesty doth here-  
by enjoin the said Government that they do not make Grants of any part  
of the lands unpeopled between the Provinces respectively now of any  
part of the three lower countries commonly called the Border. And
