A Proclamation

Whereas his Majesty by his Order in Council on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of May  
last past willing that whereas two Petitions from the Province of Mary-  
land had been presented to his Majesty at that Board the one from the  
Governor and Council & the other from the Commissary and Clergy of this  
Province which represented amongst other things that there was a suit  
depending in his Majesty's high Court of Chancery of Great Britain be-  
tween the Lord Baltimore Proprietary of Maryland & the Family  
of the Penns who are the present Proprietors of Pennsylvania concerning  
the Validity of certain Articles of Agreement entered into Between them  
for adjusting the Boundaries of their respective Provinces & that since  
the said said great Divisions & Outrages have been committed on the  
Borders of the Province of Maryland by the Inhabitants of the Pro-  
vince of Pennsylvania who had set fire to the house of Caspar when  
himself Wife and Children and six others were in it & burnt the same  
to the ground & that whilst the said persons endeavored to escape the  
Flames several Guns were fired at them whereby one Man was killed  
& others wounded & several were taken prisoners & carried to the Goals  
in Pennsylvania & that therefore the petitioners most humbly prayed amongst  
other things his Majesty's most Gracious Interpositions & Commands  
for the Preservation of the Peace on the Borders of the said Province and  
that whereas the Lords of the Committee of Council to whom his Ma-  
jesty referred the Consideration of the said Petition had made their report  
thereupon to his Majesty at that Board his Majesty that Day took  
the said Report into his Royal Consideration & was pleased with the ad-  
vice of his Privy Council to approve of what therein proposed
