All which several Facts your petitioner is ready to make out by undeniable Testimony at such time and place as your Excellency and Honours shall appoint and inasmuch as your Petitioner has with great anxiety of the Courts of Justice for a remedy against the said Judgment and Execution and that such Arbitrary proceedings are of dangerous consequence to others as well as your petitioner he therefore prays that your Excellency and Honours will be pleased to take the Case into your Consideration and do therein what to your Great Wisdom shall seem meet
