We send you herewith inclosed the Copy of an Address of the House of Commons to his Majesty in the last Session of Parliament by which you will perceive how much they apprehend the Commerce of Great Britain to have been affected by the large and frequent Emissions of Paper Money in his Majesty's Colonies in America; and his Majesty, in pursuance of the said Address, having sent Circular Instructions to the several Colonies more immediately under his Government, not to pass any more Bills for the issuing of Paper Money, without a Clause inserted therein, as proposed by the said Address, to suspend the Execution till His Majesty's Pleasure shall be signified thereupon; We think it proper to acquaint you therewith, and at the same time to admonish and advise you to pay all due Regard to his Majesty's Intention, and to the Sense of the House of Commons upon this Occasion.
