

Required to be made other Reforms &c, as by Act of Assembly; I think the Senate and
the said several Acts in force sufficient Protection against all injury from Popery; however
to further consideration thereof I hope and do repeat the Legislative Authority of the
Province will judiciously and duly determine thereupon, it is not to affect any lay Roman
Catholic in Maryland contrary to such conditions as to his Rights and Privileges he
doth enjoy throughout his Majesty's Plantations in America, nor thereby prevent the
Incomes of Inhabitants settled within the Province, any Bill for such Purposes passing
not require of you not to pass, and that you will not pass any Bill that admitteth of any
Slaves of Coloured men Winds refuted Evidence, save to affect a Judgment by any Court
of Justice any Person either in life or property whatsoever

10. And whereas at a Session of Assembly the 17th day of July in the first Year of the Dominion
of my late dear Father Charles Lord Proprietary of Marylande, Bealeton, etc, Annoque
Domini 1716, an Act passed for remitting the Payment of all such Taxes and Impositions, as
shall hereafter arise or happen upon the Breach of any penal Law of this Province, of Maryland
to the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, etc. "All Taxes Penalties, or Impositions are
made payable to the Lord Proprietary of this Province, his Heirs and Successors etc." and this
provided that it be always construed, understood, or adjudged, that where any of the said
Taxes are directed to be appropriated or applied towards the support of Government, his
Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary his Government of this Province
is intended, and none other etc. I therefore hereby require of you that you suffer no Act to
pass or violation of my Right Honour. And whereas at a Session of Assembly begun
and held the 17th day of July 1716, an Act passed intituled "For the better Security of
the Peace and Safety of this Lordships Government, and of the protestant Interest within
this Province," has enacted, provided nevertheless, that this present Act or anything therein
contained shall not extend, or be construed to extend to the Negotiation, or Management
of the Lord Proprietary his private Affairs etc. I therefore require, and direct you not to
pay any Act to have any Person to be Receiver of my Rent Rents, and other pecuniary
things belonging to me: As it is but just and reasonable with all Men, to be heir of what
Proportion of Estates in holding him as he may be the best Security in things of
private Property confidential. indeed in case of Elections of Representatives of the
Province, it will be a real Damage, and that he shall influence in the
choice of Electors aforesaid, a Captain, or Major, and shall meddle with
Matters of State or Business of the Province, he ought to be left to the Lord Proprietary,
justly here if any good man can be found.

11. In regard to the religious Education of your children delivered to you and by you transmitted
unto them, will you give them all due satisfaction in the support of the
Church, and particular Education. & That the said Law is established back to the
Year
